### Nordic Combined Ski Canada Results for Jan 9 & 10, 2010 HS 140 X/C 10km World Cups held at Val de Fiemme ITA

- Jan 9<sup>th</sup> - Jason Myslicki was 58<sup>th</sup> in the Jumping with a jump of 112m and 95pts +2:11 behind the leader Taihei Kato (JAP)
- Wesley Savill was 61<sup>st</sup> jumping 110m for 91.3pts and starting +2.43 behind the leader.
- Myslicki and Savill finished 49<sup>th</sup> and 58<sup>th</sup> respectively.
- The top three finishers were 1. Felix Gottwald (AUT), 2. Magnus Moan (NOR) and 3. Eric Frenzel (GER).

- Jan 10<sup>th</sup> - The event used the provisional results from the jumping round held on Friday Jan 8<sup>th</sup> to seed the cross-country event. Jason Myslicki was 58<sup>th</sup> 108.5m and 93.1pts +2:30 behind the leader Anssi Koivurata (FIN) and Wesley Savill was 61<sup>st</sup>, jumping 105.5m and 94.4pts +2:57 behind the leader.
- The cross-country event consisted of racing up a downhill course. Here is a quote from Wes: "We did the hill climb today. 6200m of flats, 2800 m of climbing, 500m vertical,

30% grade, should I say more? It was the toughest race that I have ever done. We started on a modified version of the XC race course, then skied 3 km to the bottom of a ski area before we started up the bottom of a downhill race course. We had to race up the course, and do switch backs, but instead of going up during the switchbacks we would go straight across the hill, and then up again. I think the best way to describe it would be to say that I had to race up a blue ski run, as hard as I could. Very hard!"

- Despite the difficulty of the course, Jason moved up 12 places into 46<sup>th</sup> and Wes moved up 10 places into 51<sup>st</sup>! Says a lot for their condition!

In August 2009, five of our Provincial Elite Team athletes and seven of our Provincial Team athletes were selected to travel to Europe to compete in various FIS, FIS Youth and Ladies Continental Cup competitions. The trip also included training at venues in Germany, Austria, and Italy.

### **Ambassadors at the Olympics**

- Provincial Team Athletes will represent Ski Jumping and Nordic Combined at the 2010 Vancouver Olympic Games.
- ASJNC athletes will be ambassadors for our sports from February 10 - 21, 2010 at Whistler Olympic Park. The team, accompanied by Altius Coach, Curtis Lyon, will be at the events promoting the sports and answering questions from spectators.
- The Vancouver Sport Production team was very excited to have these athletes included in the winter games and are currently working closely with ASJNC to get all the details finalized.
- They are even considering putting in a small jump hill for them to demo the sports! Stay tuned for further updates, as we get closer to the games.
- A family in Squamish has donated their home to the team, so parents and ASJNC are paying for only the food and transportation.
- Coach Curtis is a former ski jumper from Thunder Bay who currently works for ATCO here in Calgary. He has been coaching the Hoppers part time for a couple of years now.
- The list of ambassadors is tentative as some of them may be forejumping, but includes: Alexandra Pretorius, JC Pretorius, Jasmine Sepandj, Charlotte Mitchell, Alex More, Alex Barton, Alex Hannigan, Josh Maurer, Dusty Korek, Nathaniel Mah and Nat Seltsam.

### **Former Nordic Combined Athlete and Coach Wins Scholarship**

- Demian Carson has been awarded \$4,000 from the Hugh Pomeroy Fund to continue his human kinetics degree during this academic year. Demian was a member of the Nordic Combined National Ski Team from 1993 (his 1st World Jr. Championship) to 2001 (his last World Championship) and a respected coach in Calgary at our National Training Centre.
- Demian says "I am very grateful to the Ski Canada Foundation for funds from the Hugh Pomeroy Fund to help in pursuing my educational goals. It will go a long way toward ensuring that I am able to focus completely on my schooling."
- Hugh Pomeroy, who was struck by a car while training as a young man, was a fellow Nordic combined athlete and friend of John Heilig and Jon Servold. The Ski Canada Foundation takes applications each year for grants from a Fund in Hugh Pomeroy's name. New applications are due June 30, 2010.

- If you have a ticket to an event at any of the venues listed below and are NOT staying in the Sea to Sky region, then you will likely require a ticket on the Olympic bus network:
- **Cypress Mountain transportation** — Olympic bus network transportation is mandatory.
- **Whistler venue transportation** — Olympic bus network transportation is mandatory unless you have accommodation in the Sea to Sky region.
- When going to book transportation online to make sure you have the event code handy. This can be found on your ticket.
